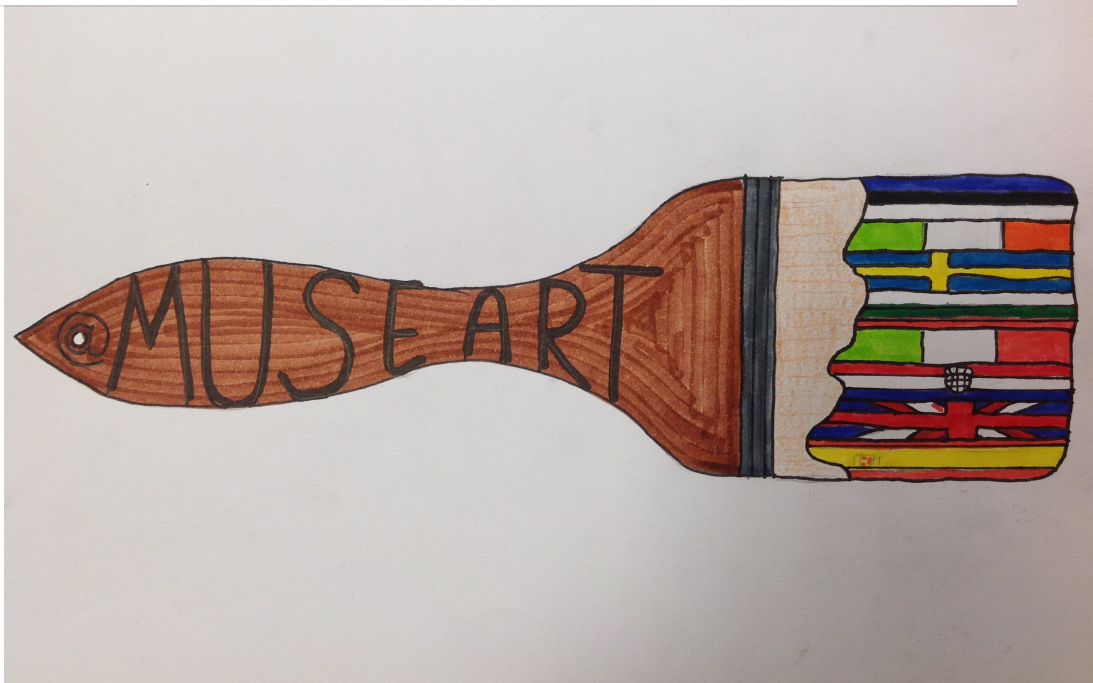

PROGETTO ERASMUS PLUS

Il nostro Istituto ha ottenuto il finanziamento per un progetto Erasmus +, della durata di tre anni (2016/17, 2017/18, 2018/19).

Nove sono i paesi coinvolti: (scuole dell'infanzia, primarie e secondarie di primo grado): **Inghilterra, Irlanda del Nord, Repubblica d'Irlanda, Estonia, Croazia, Bulgaria, Spagna, Svezia ed Italia.**

Il progetto Erasmus + **"@museart"** – unione delle parole **"art"** (arte), **"museum"** (museo), **"amusement"** (divertimento) e **@** evidenzia l'importanza cruciale delle nuove tecnologie nell'istruzione- ha lo scopo di agevolare un clima scolastico sereno, favorevole alla crescita ed al successo di tutti gli studenti che ne sono i protagonisti. Le azioni sono svolte dagli alunni e dai docenti, al di là e durante le mobilità, attraverso lo svolgimento di attività inerenti l'arte, che permettono di lavorare in modo cooperativo, e di acquisire saperi e competenze trasversali. I lavori svolti sono valutati, mettendo in evidenza, non solo le tematiche trasversali, ma anche le competenze digitali e linguistiche, poiché la lingua di comunicazione è l'inglese.

Sebbene il focus di questo progetto non sia sulla mobilità degli studenti, due piccoli gruppi avranno la possibilità di viaggiare in Spagna ed in Croazia (gli unici due paesi, oltre al nostro, che si sono offerti di ospitare i ragazzi). Proprio l'aver ospitato un gruppo di allievi spagnoli nelle classi della scuola media "Canonica" e nelle famiglie, ha permesso ai nostri giovani di vivere una grande esperienza, all'insegna della scoperta di un'altra cultura e di un'altra lingua. Inoltre i ragazzi sono stati spronati a comunicare in inglese, la lingua veicolare. Oltre alla ricerca dell'innovazione, il gruppo Erasmus ha fatto affidamento sulla cooperazione e la condivisione di buone pratiche.

È una grande opportunità per i nostri studenti e per gli adulti che animano questo progetto, alla scoperta di altri sistemi educativi e di scambi di pratiche professionali diverse, che tuttavia corrispondono alle stesse realtà.

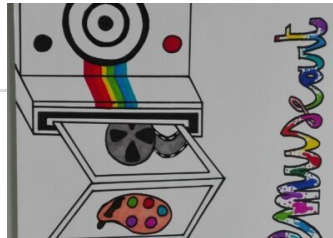
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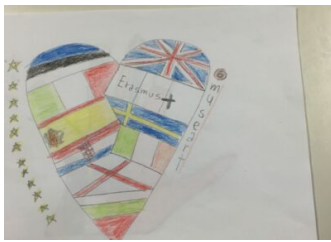
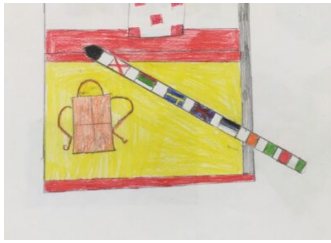

First we were greeted by Kersti. Some children performed beautiful music and we were welcomed by the mayor of the area and the school principal.

Each school made a short presentation about their school and local area.

The following decisions were made.

C6 Ireland TPM May 19th TBC

We decided on the following 5 activities for the year 2016- 2017.

1. Share presentation presented at TPM Estonia. 31/10/2016
2. Upload video 30/1/2017: Video will share information about each partner school.
3. Logo: each school will have a logo competition. We will select 2 logos on a whole school level. These will be shared with partner schools and the coordinating school will decide on the winning logo to be used for the duration of the project.

4. Calendar: Each partner will share pictures of cultural art from their areas. This pictures will be sent to Estonia. 2 pictures to be sent per country. Also to be included are important and/or historic dates for each country.
5. Christmas Cards: Christmas cards will be made by each country based on a national Christmas tradition. Each country will send a pack of cards to each of the other partners.
6. Digital Travel Guide: Each school is to create a digital travel guide based on their area. It should contain the Top 10 art and culture activities to do in their area.
7. Canvas Bags: Create artistic canvas bags based loosely on one item from your Travel Guide. The canvas bags will be sold in school to develop and enhance the children's entrepreneurial skills. A profit and loss sheet will be completed on the following.

8. Poetry/Rhymes: Poems and rhymes will be created by the children based on a common theme such as; traditions, food, friendship. It can be written in one's own language and shared with the group.

We discussed the final dates for the above:

3. Christmas Cards: 2/12/2016
4. Calendar Pictures: 16/12/2016
5. Video: 30/1/2017

We discussed that the host country of each visit will organise via email and liaise with the other coordinators. An agenda will be set one month in advance.

The LTTA's were discussed for Italy. Italy will host a variety of workshops to be detailed soon.

For teacher learning activities in Italy the following partners will train the children and teachers of the following age groups:

Nursery: Sweden and Northern Ireland

Primary: Spain, Bulgaria and Croatia

Secondary: Ireland, Estonia and England.

An etwinning space was set up for our project so that each partner can share and disseminate information.

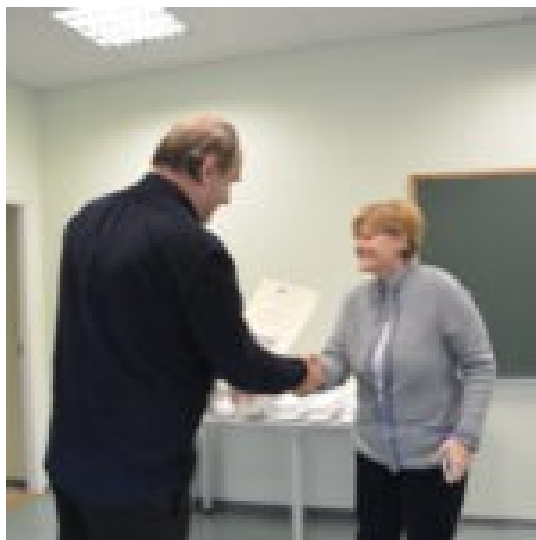
A google drive space was also set up to share information and ideas. Also to organise activities and events.

Early in the morning a trip to the local market.

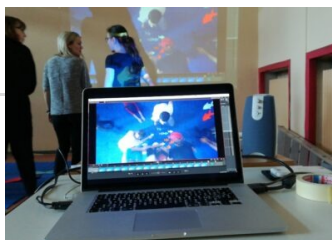
